# **Pastor's Ponderings**

"Offer to God sacrifice of thanksgiving, and pay your vows to the Most High ...." Psalm 50:14 RSV

I've read somewhere that the first Thanksgiving celebrated by Europeans in the New World happened in September near St. Augustine, Florida. And, the first English colony celebration was not at Plymouth in 1621, but here in Virginia three years earlier in December! All this to say that in all events the point and purpose was to "offer…thanksgiving to God" for successful endeavors — be it safe voyages or landings or harvests.

I grew up on the edge of the country. About a couple of miles from our house was farmland — beef cattle and rice fields. By November, the harvested rice fields were flooded to attract migrating waterfowl and to keep the land moist for planting in the spring. The sugar cane fields would be cut and most of the sugar processed by then as well. For me, November always marked the end of harvest and a time to be thankful. Which let us gather with family and friends in gratitude for each other, for the bounty of the land, and for God's love that pulled us all together. Even knowing the story of the first Thanksgiving wasn't wholly chronologically accurate, I still look forward to celebrating the season.
