Pastor's Pondering

"Therefore, just as you received Christ Jesus as Lord, continue to live your lives in Him, rooted and built up in Him and firm in your faith just as you were taught, and overflowing with thankfulness" Colossians 2:6-7 (net)

So often the words to the Church from Paul the Apostle are fiery; people have used them to browbeat others so that when Paul speaks words of encouragement or of support, one struggles to believe they come from him or that he means what has been recorded in Scripture. The *Letter to the Colossians* is generally understood as a pastoral letter reminding the church(s) in that region of the centrality of Jesus the Christ and of the importance of holding fast to faith in that centrality.

With all the chaos, the cacophony of competing claims about the future or its uncertainty, we can draw strength and inspiration from the words above. As the New Year unfolds, changes will come — some simply because time marches on; some because other people will say or do things that trigger or foster shifts that impact our lives directly or indirectly; still other modifications may occur that cause us to question our lives together. It is then when we need to draw on our faith, our trust in God, in Jesus, by the power of the Holy Spirit.

I encourage you all to be open to change that reflects and lives into God's love, grace, peace, hope, and joy. For in doing so, we become faithful witnesses to our Lord Christ Jesus, growing from our roots, building up our common trust and certain belief in Him, and "overflowing with thankfulness." Peace.
