Pastor's Ponderings

"And again [Jesus] said, 'To what should I compare the kingdom of God?" Luke 13:20 (NRSV)

For many years I served as an intentional interim minister. I did then, and continue to do, a lot of thinking about change. I've learned that change will occur whether I'm ready or not. I've learned that change is a natural progression of life – we are born, we live, we grow old, we die – and in between all that we change. Groups and communities change; sometimes in positive ways, sometimes negatively. Roy Oswald and Robert Friedrich, two church consultants, have noted that when three important factors converge, positive change is much more likely to occur. The three factors, what Oswald and Friedrich call *climate*, *logic*, and *vision*, are interrelated, and no one of them can be left out.

Climate can be described as the general sense of warmth and good feelings members have toward one another and the willingness to extend hospitality to strangers. It is the first thing a visitor will sense when he or she comes through the door. Logic describes the commonly held understanding within a group of what it means to be a faithful member. Logic is closely related to discipleship; about how we change from a person centered on self to a person centered on God's joy, grace, and service. Vision is simply our common understanding of where we believe God wants us to go in the future.

How do these three factors relate to Jesus' descriptions of God's kingdom? And, how well do we live out these factors so others see (and want to be a part of) God's kingdom present among us here and now? March is often when we begin to see changes in our natural surroundings — trees and flowers can begin budding; grass starts to turn green, birds begin nesting. We look forward to those changes. Will we ponder how changes in our lives help us see God at work in the world?
