Pastor's Ponderings

"Jesus ... said to the crowds, "When you see a cloud rising in the west, you say at once, 'A rainstorm is coming,' and it does.... You know how to interpret the appearance of the earth and the sky, but how can you not know how to interpret the present time?" Luke 12:54, 56 (NET)

You all know by now how much I pay attention to the weather. And, that this interest comes from my childhood when my father was an active drilling engineer in the oilfield and had to watch the weather for high winds, rain, hail, hurricanes, even tornadoes that might impact the rigs and crews at work.

But this metaphor attributed to Jesus is also about reading the signs of the times. Here in USAmerica, we have often sat back and watched events unfold that to many of us, seem trivial, or unimportant, non-impactful to our life in Central Virginia. Yet, we often overlook the effects such incidents have on the lives of others — some whom we know, others whom we do not. This might seem political, but in reality, it's communal, about showing God's love and care in, for, and through our community.

Jesus calls is to live in harmony with others; to show a love, concern, and compassion for others — especially the most vulnerable among us. It bears repeating: Compassion is the action of bringing love and care alongside others in their suffering. Some of you may know of Karen Armstrong, a former British Roman Catholic; she offers this about the importance of compassion: "If it is not tempered by compassion, and empathy, reason [alone] can lead men and women into a moral void, and even into a kind of madness."

We can't reason our way out of all that's going on in our lives. Our need for God's love is ever more important, and equally as vital, that we show God's love through our acts of compassion and empathy.
