## **History of Father's Day**

It has been over fifty years since President Richard Nixon's administration declared the third Sunday in June a day to recognize and honor the role of fathers in society. That occurred in 1972.

The first known Father's Day service occurred in Fairmont, West Virginia, on July 5, 1908 after hundreds of men died in the worst mining accident in U.S. history. Grace Golden Clayton, the daughter of a dedicated minister, proposed a service to honor all fathers, especially those who had died in the mines. However, the observance did not become an annual event, and it was not well promoted; very few people outside of the local area knew about it. Meanwhile, in 1909, Sonora Smart Dodd of Spokane, Washington, was inspired by her father, William Jackson Smart, a farmer and Civil War veteran who was a single parent who raised Sonora and her five brothers by himself after his wife died in childbirth. Within a few months, Sonora had convinced the Spokane Ministerial Association and the YMCA to set aside the third Sunday in June as Father's Day. Thus, on June 19, 1910, Father's Day events in Spokane commenced.

The widely publicized Father's Day events in Spokane struck a chord that reached all the way to Washinton, D.C. However, it wasn't until 1972 that Congress passed an act officially making Father's Day a national holiday to be celebrated each year on the third Sunday of June. This was 58 years after Mother's Day was officially recognized in the U.S. in 1914.
