Saving Eggshells for the Birds



Spring is in the air and nesting season is in full swing! Female birds are laying their eggs. In order for the shells to be strong enough to hold the developing chicks, mama bird will have to greatly increase her calcium intake. Finding enough extra calcium in the wild can be difficult. However, there are ways that we can help. The first step is to fill our feeders with calcium enriched seed and to also have suet available. Another way we can help our birds get calcium is to put out chicken eggshells. Chicken eggshells contain the calcium that wild birds are in search of during this time.

Here's how to prepare the eggshells:

After using eggs, rinse the eggshells with water. This removes the membrane and any remaining egg. At this point, you can collect the shells in a container and store them in the refrigerator until you are ready to dry them in the oven. Preheat your oven to 250 degrees. Spread rinsed shells on a rimmed baking sheet. Bake the shells at 250 degrees for 10 minutes. You want the shells to be dry, but not browned. Cool. Place in a zip lock bag and crush into pieces no bigger than the size of a sunflower seed. Do not crush into a powder.

Now the eggshells are ready to be added to birdseed, placed in a tray feeder, or scattered on open ground. Not only are you helping our wild bird population, but you have also reduced the amount of waste going into our landfills. Thank you for caring for God's creation and His creatures.
